

## ***The week in review (Oct. 11-15)***

### ***Volleyball***

Linn-Benton took control of first place in the South Division with their five-game match victory at Southwestern Oregon on Oct. 14. The Roadrunners used 21 kills from Chelsea Hartman, and 19 kills with 28 digs from Erika Nay to run their league record to 6-2 and 24-7 overall. SOCC maintained their second place standing with a home win against Chemeketa the following day. Bellevue, Green River and Walla Walla still lead the other three divisions with unbeaten league records. The Bulldogs used road wins at Skagit Valley and Shoreline to keep one game ahead of Whatcom. Jenny Freed had 19 kills in helping BCC sweep the two matches. GRCC's two matches were also three-game sweeps as Lindsey Rice had a combined 30 kills against Pierce and Centralia. Walla Walla, who owns the NWAACC's best overall record at 20-4, swept a home match against Big Bend as Elizabeth Shuyler and Britney Kubik each had 12 kills.

### ***Men's soccer***

Whatcom continues their amazing run as the Orcas blanked Shoreline 1-0 and Skagit Valley 3-0 to run their league record to 9-1-2. WCC, in their first year in men's soccer, currently lead both those schools by 12 points. Defending champion Highline also used shutouts to stretch their lead in the West as the T-Birds are 11-0-1 in league and have outscored their opponents 54-3. The East still has Walla Walla on top by five points over Wenatchee Valley. The Warriors beat Columbia Basin 7-1 on Oct. 11 then went on a weekend road trip and shut out South Puget Sound and Clark. Wenatchee Valley blanked Columbia Basin and Treasure Valley to keep pace with WWCC. Still on top of the South Division is Southwestern Oregon who ripped Pierce 10-1 on Oct. 15. The Lakers are currently four points in front of Clark. WVC's Ceveriano Garcia, with 17 goals, has taken over the goal scoring lead from Walla Walla's Fidel Angulo, who has tallied 14. Highline's Steve Mohn and Emanuel Nistriani currently have 11 and 10 goals, respectively. Walla Walla, Highline and Whatcom each have nine shutouts this season as WCC goalie Robbie Wright has been in goal for every one of the Orcas' nine whitewashings.

### ***Women's soccer***

The race in the West continues to be the best as seven points separate the five teams. Highline took over the top spot with a 3-0 victory over Olympic on Oct. 13. Two days later, Tacoma blanked OC 4-0 and a currently in second place over Bellevue and Green River, the latter two battling to a scoreless tie. Walla Walla, Shoreline and Clackamas continue to maintain big leads in their divisions with the Warriors pulling off road wins at Columbia Basin, Lane and Clark and the Dolphins stretching their lead to 22 points after a 7-1 triumph at Everett. Clackamas needed a goal by Hannah Nash with eight minutes remaining to escape with a 2-2 tie at Southwestern Oregon. Nash had both of the Cougars' goals, this coming off scoring three and four goals in home games last week against Lane and Clark, respectively. She's currently tied with Tacoma's Rachel Maus for third in league scoring with 14 goals. Walla Walla's Shelley Ikerd currently leads with 24 goals followed by teammate Lauryn Koelzer with 22. Koelzer is the overall leader in scoring as she also has 16 assists. Jackie Burnett of Bellevue is the top goalie with six shutouts.

### ***Cross Country***

Spokane hosted Treasure Valley and Tacoma, as well as several four-year college teams in the Bigfoot Invitational on Oct. 15. The CCS women placed fifth led by the Katie Compogno who finished in 20th place. The Sasquatch men fared much better as they won the event with 28 points as they place four runners in the top nine. Andrew Fuller paved the way with time of 25:28, good enough for second place.
